Reading: We are focusing on character, setting, dilemma and solution as we integrate and study fairy tales. Ask your child what a dilemma is. We will start practicing for fluency as we begin working on our Reader's Theaters plays. This week we added sound effects and made shadow puppets for our performance next week.

Writing: The children have been working on a narrative piece of art. We can't wait to share them with you when you come for our performance on Thursday, Dec. 21st.

Math: In Unit 4 we worked on measurement, but we also are working on totals of 10 and doubles. Learning these important facts helps when we work on addition strategies.

Science: We have completed our bone unit. The children worked hard to figure out that our mystery bones came from a frog. Our animal this week is a Polar Bear.

Word Study: We will begin with a review of short vowels, being sure every word has a vowel (syllable too!) and that it's the correct vowel. We have done short a, I and o and will move on to u.

School Arrival and Dismissal

Remember that the children are allowed into the building at **7:35.** There is no supervision before this time. **The tardy bell rings at 7:55.** That is the official start time to our day. If your child is a parent drop-off in the morning and you would like to have them eat breakfast you should plan to drop them as close to 7:35 as possible. This way they have time to eat their breakfast and be ready to learn at the start of our day. All children are expected to be here by then or they will be marked absent or tardy. We will dismiss buses first this year at 2:50 and then parent
