Reading: When your child brings home a book in a baggie to read to you, please sign the form and return the book the next day, or as soon as possible. Thanks!

Writing: We are working on a writing craft rubric. We are trying to paint a picture in our listener's mind and write using our 5 senses. We use an opening line, write supporting details and then an ending. We are working on interesting, descriptive language.

Math: In Unit 3 we are learning how to talk about what strategy we've used to solve a problem. We are learning to talk about our math thinking and how we've gotten an answer. **Our focus this week was word problems. We are using number lines to help us solve problems. We also are learning to skip count using a calculator.**

Science: We have started our bone study. Anyone with any expertise feel free to come visit with us about our amazing bones. We love learning how our bodies work. Our animal this week is a gorilla! He reminds us of Ivan.

Word Study: We will begin with a review of short vowels, being sure every word has a vowel (syllable too!) and that it's the correct vowel. We have done short a and I and will move on to short u next week.

School Arrival and Dismissal

Remember that the children are allowed into the building at **7:35**. There is no supervision before this time. **The tardy bell rings at 7:55.** That is the official start time to our day. If your child is a parent drop-off in the morning and you would like to have them eat breakfast you should plan to drop them as close to 7:35 as possible. This way they have time to eat their breakfast and be ready to learn at the start of our day. All children are expected to be here by then or they will be marked absent or tardy. We will dismiss buses first this year at 2:50 and then parent
